Partnerships for Pupils

John C. Fremont School

Farm Day is Kings County Farm Bureau's biggest annual event every March. Farm Day best demonstrates what Farm Bureau is all about by bringing together around 2,400 third graders across Kings County for an interactive field trip about farming.

John C. Fremont 3rd-grade students had a fantastic day on March 16. They learned about agricultural jobs and about how tractors are used. Students could dig in the dirt and find worms in the earth. A vet talked about his career and how he could check a cow for a baby calf. Then students listened to their heartbeat with a stethoscope. The 3rd graders saw pigs, piglets, and goats and learned about their characteristics. They planted lettuce and took the plants home. Of course, the biggest hit was eating ice cream. The students came back and wrote about their experiences, and some created presentations using Keynote.






