- 2. Resource Development: Parents can help create educational resources like flashcards or study guides. Many of these items can be worked on at home, especially for parents who are unavailable during the day and would like to support the classroom/school from home.
- **3. Library Aides:** Support the school's library by helping with book check-outs, organizing shelves, or even reading stories to students.
- **4. Guest Speakers:** Parents often have unique skills, careers, or life experiences they can share as guest speakers, enhancing classroom learning.
- **5. School Committees:** Parents can assist with decision-making opportunities at the school by participating in the School Site Council (SSC) and the English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC).
- **6. Safety and Supervision:** Parents can volunteer their time helping to supervise morning student drop-offs, lunchtime supervision, or student dismissal.

What is DELAC?

District English Learner Advisory Committee

DELAC provides a forum for parents/guardians to advise, assist and provide recommendations to District administration and the Board of Trustees for the continuing improvement of programs, services, and policies for English learners and their families. They also advise on matters related to the EL Master Plan, district wide needs, intervention programs, professional development, and any other language needs pertaining to English learners.

The Committee is composed of elected ELAC representatives from each of the CJUSD schools with 21 or more English Learners. In the case of our district, all five comprehensive schools have representatives as voting members. Though the committee has voting members, all DELAC meetings are open to the public and may provide comments related to topics on the agenda.

DELAC informs parent representatives so they can take the information back to the school site. Topics that are addressed during the meetings include, but are not limited to: understanding ELPAC data, student Reclassification, ELD requirements, Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) funding for English learners, LCAP Input, Categorical (Federal) Program Monitoring and compliance.
